<u>Kathy Parrish</u>, our Volunteer Coordinator for Congregational Care, will be assisting Jane with the presentation. Kathy graduated from UF with a BS in Health Education and from Mercer's Georgia Baptist College of Nursing as an RN. Since 1987, she has worked in over ten different areas of nursing, covering the life span from Neonatal Intensive Care to Hospice. But her favorite nursing was working in parish nursing in Baptist churches in Georgia where she and Pastor Buddy established a model for how to start a Health Ministries program. In their last congregation, she served in the role of Congregational Nurse on staff full-time
